How have your students benefited from **educational travel**?

If My first European adventure was with another company that another teacher set up and though it was less expensive, you have to consider all the corners the company cut. For example, students were hungry after the meals and were told they could not receive any more food. So our adult travelers sacrificed their meal portions to give to the students or they bought more food afterwards. When a traveler was injured (who had purchased the premium medical plan), the insurance company refused to pay.

Last year was my first trip with ACIS – I inherited it from a teacher who could not travel. After our first trip to England, France and Germany (a WWII tour), I was so impressed with the quality of lodging, food, tour guide and sites that I am sticking with ACIS!"
